We provide a high-quality training service, offering good value for money. Courses are run from our training base or centres in the city and we can run the course at your setting.




Disability Awareness Training

Manual Handling – using hoists to move people

This course is suitable for anyone who works in the care sector and has no previous training within manual handling. The aim of this course is to learn why manual handling is important within the care sector and to be able to demonstrate correct manual handling techniques.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To identify legislation in relation to manual handling.
- To consider the causes of back pain in relation to manual handling.
- To complete a Manual Handling risk assessment
- To perform correct techniques and recognize poor techniques of others.
- To know how to use equipment and what procedures to follow when using any manual handling equipment.

Proloquo2Go Training

This course is aimed at learners who are working with children and young people who are moving onto or already use Prologue2Go – (which is a symbol based communication app). The course will inform the learner how to use the communication app Proloquo2Go, from setting up to customizing it to suit the child or young person.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To outline the Crescendo vocabulary system – Proloquo2go uses a tiered system, each one focusing on core words - which we need to make up most of what we say.
- To create a new user and customize vocabulary content for that user including creating new buttons and folders.
- Customizing and using the grammar support feature for proloquo2go
- Adapting the Proloquo2Go app so it meets the individual needs visual, motor and cognitive needs.
- Creating and working with user backup files.

Sensory Play Training

This course is aimed at learners who are working with children and young people. The aim of the course is to develop knowledge of the senses and the way sensory information can be processed. To understand the importance of sensory play in learning and development learners will be taking part in practical activities, which will explore potential barriers and ways of overcoming these.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To develop knowledge of the senses and the way sensory information can be processed.
- To understand the importance of sensory play in learning and development.
- To explore some of the potential barriers to play.
- To explore and discuss the individual needs of children or adults and the need to understand and respect sensory integration disorders.
- To investigate a variety of resources- specialist, natural and heuristic. Discuss and explore the possible uses and accessibility of these.
- To emphasize that by gaining a fuller understanding of a child's or adult's needs, likes and dislikes, each worker can play a more significant part in releasing their full potential.
- To explore briefly the potential barriers to accessing the wider community with sensory integration disorders.
- To identify relevant professionals and procedures to refer to when additional support may be required.
