Domestic Abuse Champions Training

Educator Solutions

Course Outline

This two-day Domestic Abuse Champions Course is aimed at any professionals who come into contact with domestic abuse. On average 1/5 children in the UK are exposed to domestic abuse, with children aged 16-19 being the most likely victims of abuse. Schools are therefore in a prime position to both recognise domestic abuse and support children who might be detrimentally affected.

Outcomes

By the end of day one professionals will have an understanding of domestic abuse and power and control methods perpetrators use on victims. They will be able to recognise signs and symptoms of domestic abuse, with an understanding of both the physical and emotional impact of abuse. They will have an understanding of the challenges and risks that victims face when attempting to leave an abusive partner. They will be able to identify the impact on children who have witnessed abuse and an understanding of what enables some children to be resilient. They will also have an underpinning knowledge of Honour Based Abuse, Forced Marriage and Female Genital Mutilation.

By the end of day two professionals will have a better knowledge in how to support victims of abuse. They will be considering their own school's policies and procedures on domestic abuse, and what support themselves and colleagues are entitled to. They will learn how to safely encourage victims to disclose and how to respond to the disclosures. They will have an understanding of the DASH (domestic abuse, stalking, harassment and honour based abuse risk assessment) and high risk indicators for victims. They will learn about the MARAC (multi-agency risk assessment conference) in which high risk victims are referred to. They will gain an understanding of safety measures available and how to safely plan with victims and children. They will have a better knowledge of the educational toolkits that can be used in schools. They will learn about local support agencies to refer victims and children to for support.
