Visual Stress Assessment Training

Do you work with a child that could be suffering from visual stress, including squinting, becoming distracted or restless, needing to read with a ruler or following words with their finger?

Outline

Visual stress is thought to be the most common visual reason for reading difficulties and describes unpleasant visual symptoms when viewing text, especially for long periods of time. Alternative names may be used to describe this condition including, Meares-Irlen Syndrome, Irlen Syndrome and Scotopic Sensitivity Syndrome.

The prevalence of visual stress has been reported as occurring in 5 - 20% of the population (British Dyslexia Association 2012), many of which suffer unknowingly or may be misdiagnosed. In people with dyslexia this is thought to be higher at around 35-40% (Wilkins 2003).

It is not a diagnosed visual impairment or eye condition and is more like a Specific Learning Difficulty. Therefore, Virtual School Sensory Support is, from September 2017, only able to provide an assessment for Visual Stress as a Traded Service to education settings across Norfolk.

Description

VSSS would like to offer a half-day training session each academic year to support staff in settings to assess in-house. These training events will be designed to enable settings to carry out their own assessments and the assessment materials will be supplied by VSSS with extra materials available at cost.

Outcome

- Raise awareness about Visual Stress and impact on learning.
- To support staff in settings to assess in-house.

• To explain what can be done to help children/ young people who are susceptible to Visual Stress. (Description of overlay selection procedure and rate of reading, test use of the assessment pack, information about other ways to manage the condition in the classroom).
