

John Muir Award Leader Training



The [John Muir Award](#) is an environmental award scheme which aims to help people to connect with nature and enjoy and care for wild places. It's for people of all backgrounds and is non-competitive and accessible. People use the John Muir Award to help promote personal development, a sense of responsibility towards the natural world and to recognise the achievements of individuals and groups taking part in outdoor experiences.



Leader Training is a **two-day residential course** that gives a thorough introduction to the relevant skills, knowledge and approaches needed for delivering the John Muir Award. Content is aimed at leaders already experienced in working with groups of young people, adults and families. These open-enrolment courses tend to bring together leaders from a wide range of sectors.

Attending training **is not a requirement** to be able to run the John Muir Award but it is organised periodically at locations around the UK **in addition** to information and resources available online, to help leaders to find out more about the ethos of the John Muir Award and practicalities of delivering it. Courses offer a complementary, thorough introduction, with opportunities to network with others interested in running the Award, and to further develop skills and confidence.
