

Family Story

Maisy's Story

The II-year-old, from Dovercourt in Essex, had a tough start to life, born nine weeks prematurely by emergency caesarean. She now lives with quadriplegic cerebral palsy, she's also blind and has up to 40 seizures a day.

Maisy, as well as her dad Matt, mum Sophie and six-year-old sister Poppy, have been receiving support at The Treehouse since 2012.

Sophie said: "We were apprehensive at first - not sure whether we were ready to admit we needed a hospice's input. I feel there is a huge stigma attached



to the word hospice and we were always trying to escape the reality of what Maisy's lifethreatening conditions meant.

After doing a little research I discovered EACH - the support and services they provide are so wonderful not just for Maisy but to us all as a family." Maisy has music therapy sessions through The Treehouse and also takes part in specialist play activities, both of which have helped her to progress. The experience has been inclusive for all the family, with Poppy able to take part in sibling sessions and mum and dad in similar activities for parents.



"I cannot imagine our lives without EACH now and I sometimes wish we hadn't let the fear of the word hospice put us off for so long," said Sophie.
