Anne will lead a keynote focusing on the role of variation in teaching and learning mathematics, with a focus on measurement. Through doing some tasks and discussing them we will go deeply into what variation means and how it can be used by teachers to direct and enhance learning and bring new insights. She aims to cut through the theory and focus on how variation naturally arises helpfully when we do mathematics.
