riverside history & nature in the cathedral Close ...



Walk for just 4-5 minutes from the Cathedral and this is what you see. *Pull's Ferry,* the place on the River Wensum where the stone, shipped over from Caen in Northern France in 1096 to build Norwich Cathedral Priory, began its final trip upstream to the building site.

It is a beautiful spot and makes a wonderful outdoor addition to many school visit programmes, especially if you are looking at your locality/Normans. There are also opportunities for nature studies and comparative Geography work as we examine the features and changes to the site with the children. We'd like to develop more 'out door' activities on the riverside and in the grounds round the cathedral. Unusual trees, sculpture, and the medicinal herb garden used by the medieval monks can be incorporated into any programme. Do tell us your ideas!
