

Celebrating Difference in the EYFS

Course Outline

The early years are a crucial stage in every child's life, and we know that when children are supported to celebrate the diversity of the world around them, it helps to prevent prejudice developing.

Settings have a duty to challenge gender stereotyping and celebrate all diversity, including LGBT people and their families, to support every child to understand and embrace difference.

This course will explain why thinking about lesbian, gay, bi and trans inclusion is important in early years and how this fits into existing practice and wider inclusion work. It will show staff how to meet the statutory requirements of the EYFS and can be attended by any practitioner working with children aged 0-5, whatever their role, confidence level or knowledge of diversity and inclusion.

The EYFS has a legal standard to that requires early years settings to celebrate difference and tackle gender stereotypes. This duty is underpinned by the Equality Act 2010 and is inspected by Ofsted.
