# Effective identification of need

Virtual School Sensory Support carried out 349 referrals from schools and other agencies last year.



#### • 1232 Children and Young People on roll

All new referrals are contacted within 5 working days.

Assessment and final report is distributed within 26 working days.

#### • 444 specialist pieces of equipment used by students

- Over 39 new EHCP assessments completed, 538 EHCPs in place and VSSS completed 36 conversions for the LA





# Effectiveness in assessing and meeting needs

- 92% of children and young people feel safe at school
- 96% get the help they need
- 88% feel school staff understand their needs

### I do feel that staff give me what I need....If I need help I go to SEN and they help me

Nothing is not working...I think we are at a point where everything is alright. Ms M is very diligent on checking in with me, but I've never needed to go to her for help

Significant improvement of teachers' and teaching assistants' confidence in meeting the needs of children & young people for the second year running (feedback from settings on impact of VSSS support)

### Although B struggles in school, the support we have received has been invaluable and made B a happier pupil in school

- Over 10,000 interventions carried out annually
- Trained over 300 teaching assistants in the BTEC Level 3 Qualification over the last 7 years
- 68% of visually impaired and 81% deaf children and young people are educated in mainstream settings

## Improving outcomes

- 84% of children and young people say they enjoy school
- 100% had planned education, employment or apprenticeship at post 16 - 0% NEET compared with 10.1% for SEND Nationally

I am happy at this school and pleased with my reading progress. I would like to be a teacher one day or a hairdresser

- 74% of deaf CYP achieved a 4 or more in both English and Maths significantly above National, Norfolk and deaf nationally
- 39% of deaf CYP achieved the threshold in both in English and Maths – just below National and Norfolk but above deaf nationally
- Average Progress 8 score for deaf CYP was above national, Norfolk and deaf nationally
- 50% of VI CYP achieved the expected standard reading, writing and maths
- 9% achieved a high standard in reading, writing and maths equal to national and above Norfolk





# Leadership and management



Extra-curricular activities e.g. Sandringham Teddy Bears Picnic are organised each year. The aim is to encourage children, young people and their families to meet each other providing invaluable support and guidance. This sharing of ideas and support is also encouraged through the Website and Facebook Pages. Specific activities are put on for children and young people which enhance their confidence, self-esteem and mental health and well-being e.g. Bewilderwood.

To date, VSSS has supported the training of over 25 teachers in the mandatory qualifications to support deaf, visually impaired and multi-sensory impaired children and young people.
