Norman Adventures!

Why not explore
Normans & Medieval life
in your locality?







If you are looking to investigate the history of your locality, why not come and get 'hands on' here? Chip away at some stone with ancient mason's tools & learn about how the Cathedral was built after the Norman invasion.

R.E LINKS... explore how the monks came here to build their priory/monastery. Lots of practical activities that link in with learning about the lay-out of a Christian church and the way in which monastic worship traditions live on here today. Children dress as monks, illuminate letters using quills & ink, explore prayer and more.







Benedictine monks cared for visitors & pilgrims and looked after the Cathedral & monastery (Priory) 900 years ago. They were made to leave when King Henry VIII's commissioners arrived in 1538 to close the monastery & smash it up!

DID YOU KNOW?

If you come into the Cathedral during the Christmas & Easter seasons you will see a huge, wicker sculptured angel swinging from the ceiling in the nave.



This wonderful sculpture replicates a Medieval wooden angel that used to swing there 900 years ago with burning charcoal in it, onto which incense was sprinkled. It spun round during worship and the scented smoke filled the air to remind all that their prayers were rising up to God in heaven, just like the smelly smoke!
