Do your students use Snapchat? If so please advise them around the danger of Snap Maps. These can pinpoint the location a child lives within a few houses, as well as narrowing down the school they attend. Please encourage them to ensure their settings are on 'Ghost Mode'. Even if they argue their privacy settings are 'friends only' they need to remember they could be hacked or have fake friends on their account.

Please be aware of concerns about students potentially taking Xanax to help them relax for their exams. It is an offence to be in possession of this type of medication if it hasn't been prescribed to you. It is also potentially dangerous. This drug is like a sedative and can cause extreme drowsiness and could therefore cloud your judgement when performing simple tasks such as crossing the road.
