

Developing pupils' dispositions and behaviours to succeed

When learners engage with learning they are 'behaving as learners' and without the character dispositions to behave in this way they cannot translate their potential into outcomes.

Course Outline

This course is informed by current research findings and the requirement by the DfE for schools to develop character traits that will support pupils to succeed. It will look at how key learning dispositions can be taught and how this develops self-efficacy and an internal locus of control which moves learners from simply 'I can' to 'I do'. With a focus on practical and immediate application back in the classroom, delegates will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to inform, and potentially transform, their own practice and that of the school more widely.

By the end of the course participants will:-

- understand how the development of character dispositions and learning behaviours, are necessary for pupils' success in school
- know how to teach learning behaviours in a range of contexts
- reflect on how to evaluate the impact of learning behaviours on learning outcomes
- have a range of ideas of how to create an environment in their classroom and school that celebrates behaviours for learning
