Twilight sessions are costed at £50 per session, schools with an EPSS contract or EPSS subscription are able to book places at a reduced price of £40.

Critical Incident Training is offered free to all local authority schools, and academies and independent schools which pay an annual subscription to the Norfolk Critical Incident Service. Other schools/academies pay £120 for full-day courses, £80 for half-day courses and £50 for twilight sessions. A £10 discount is available for schools with an EPSS contract.

The courses 'Self-harm and Suicide prevention' and 'Teaching about mental health and emotional well-being' are offered free of charge to all school settings in Norfolk & Waveney as part of funded suicide prevention activities.

Outline

The training session provides an overview of the Autism Spectrum

Using social stories and comic strip conversations

Outline

Social stories and comic strip conversations are techniques, developed by Carol Gray, to support social children and young people with an Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Social stories and comic strip conversations aim to present information in a literal, 'concrete' way, which may improve a person's understanding of a previously difficult or ambiguous situation or activity.

Description

This course will give an understanding around

- social stories and ASD
- the structure of a social story
- comic strip conversations and ASD
- the structure of comic strip conversations and ASD
- Using social and comic strip stories effectively with an individual with ASD

Outcome

Participants will be able to write and use social stories and comic strip conversations to support children and young people.

Supporting bereaved children in school communities

Outline

The Childhood Bereavement Network estimates that 2.7% of children in Norfolk have experienced the death of a parent or sibling.

Description

Children who are bereaved often turn to adults they have a trusting relationship with, and within schools this can be any member of staff.

This course will give an overview of children's needs after a bereavement, but will also explore the specific role that school staff can play. We will look at some typical issues that schools are faced with, and consider what role school can take pro-actively in preparing for and helping children following a bereavement.

Outcome

Aims of the Training Event

• To develop a good understanding of the effects of bereavement on children, including their learning and their behaviour

- To gain knowledge about how to support bereaved children effectively, and how to respond to bereaved parents
- To gain confidence in supporting children and their families

Outline

Loss and bereavement are an inevitable part of our lives, and it is important to prepare children and young people for this experience. We can teach this pro-actively, as well as allow natural discussion about death as it arises in everyday life. Children and young people say that they want to learn about it, and we can teach them some valuable skills to help them deal with the most certain experience.

Description

During this short course we will talk about the role of teaching about death and bereavement throughout school, we will share teaching materials as we want to encourage all schools to help prepare children for the experience of death.

Outcome

Staff will be more confident in teaching about death and bereavement, and have some ideas about how they can do that.

Audience

Class teachers in primary schools All staff teaching PSHE whether in dedicated PSHE lessons or through form time, off time-table days, etc.

Supporting children with traumatic experiences

Outline

Children, like adults, sometimes experience or witness something extremely frightening and dangerous. This can cause a traumatic stress reaction, which affects the way the child thinks, feels and behaves.

Description

In this training event we will explore how children are affected by traumatic events, and how schools can support. We will have a look at the impact of adverse childhood experiences (ACE's), how schools can undertake steps to become an ACE aware school, and how this fits in with supporting children with emotional health and well-being.

Outcome

Attending this workshop will enable you to:

- Know how children are affected by traumatic events and be able recognise signs and symptoms
- Understand the possible impact on learning and behaviour
- Identify strategies which will support children who have experienced trauma
- know about accessing additional support

Outline

This training will cover self-harm and suicide prevention within the context of schools. It is free for all Norfolk and Waveney schools.

Description

We will consider why young people may self-harm and what schools can do to offer support. We will think about when young people are at risk of suicide, and consider carefully what schools need to do when they are worried about a young person.

Outcomes

- To increase knowledge about self-harm and suicide
- To understand how schools can support young people
- Be confident in using the guidance 'What to do if you believe a child might be at risk of suicide'

Audience

Headteachers, senior leaders (schools), designated safeguarding staff, school mental health leads, pastoral staff, other school staff interested in self-harm and suicide prevention

This course is funded as part of our suicide prevention activities for Norfolk & Waveney- we expect attending schools to share the content of this course with all staff. Max. 2 delegates per school.

Outline

Teaching about mental health and emotional well-being promotes pupils' well-being through the development of healthy coping strategies and an understanding of their own emotions as well as those of other people.

Description

This half-day workshop will support you in developing the skills, knowledge and understanding needed to teach this crucial but challenging aspect of the PSHE education curriculum safely and effectively.

Outcomes

- Increase your confidence in teaching about mental health and emotional wellbeing
- Develop skills and strategies for keeping vulnerable pupils safe
- Explore a range of resources and activities you could use at school including DfE approved lesson plans

Senior Leaders (KS3&4) PSHE/SMSC Co-ordinators and teaching staff (KS3&4) Form tutors and other staff who are teaching PSHE/SMSC (KS3&4)
