The course is for you if you are:

Often required to undertake educational testing of pupils or understand professional reports written by others (CCET)

Required to undertake testing for Access Arrangements as an access arrangements assessor (AAC)*

*(to become an access arrangements assessor and meet the JCQ requirements you will need to hold QTS or be an HLTA with an undergraduate degree)

Course Content:

- Understand the purposes of testing & assessment
- Become familiar with theories about testing & psychometrics
- Understand the legislative and policy framework
- Select, evaluate, administer and interpret different types of educational tests
- Carry out an assessment of a learner and report the findings

This course is run by Real Training and hosted and supported by the Dyslexia Outreach Service. You will receive support during and after training if requested as well as access to resources & tests.

This course is for you if you are:

- Interested in dyslexia and wanting to further your understanding of dyslexia
- Working with pupils with dyslexia

Prior Knowledge: You do not need to know anything about dyslexia

Course Content:

- Different definitions of dyslexia
- Characteristic features of dyslexia
- The social, emotional and behavioural impact of dyslexia
- What issues are faced by dyslexic learners when learning to read, spell and write
- How dyslexia may affect the development of numeracy skills
- What assessments are available and how they might be used
- Many different strategies for addressing the barriers to learning that individuals with dyslexia may face, including the use of assistive technology
- Sources of support

Course Fee: £350 per person (£315 to DOS members), to include a toolkit of dyslexia friendly resources.

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
