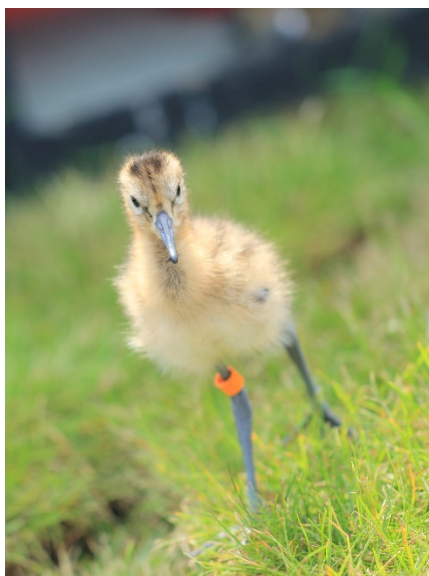


Become a Godwit Guardian with Project Godwit

Black-tailed godwits are a rare wading bird on the brink of extinction as a breeding bird in the UK. There are fewer than 50 pairs remaining and most of them are found in the Cambridgeshire and Norfolk fens. Project Godwit is a partnership project between the RSPB and WWT which is aiming to turn around their fortunes.

We've been rearing and releasing birds at sites in the fens to help this small population recover. **If your local school or community group is in Cambridgeshire, Norfolk or Lincolnshire, you could get involved in the project by becoming a Godwit Guardian.**



Becoming a Guardian is free, fun and links you to one of the godwits. You will be able to follow your bird's progress over the coming years, as they make a home in the Fens and head off each year on migration across Europe and Africa. Your group, school or class's name will then be put up on our website alongside your chosen bird and you will also be sent a Godwit Guardian certificate and a profile of your chosen bird. Project staff and volunteers may be available to visit local schools and community groups to talk about these amazing godwits and their fenland homes.
