SafeToNet supporting Odd Socks Day 2019

SafeToNet, have launched their new app that detects cyberbullying and helps guide children to make better choices about what they send/share online, while giving parents an indication of risks, and prompting conversations about staying safe online. They are the official supporters of Odd Socks Day 2019. SafeToNet will be offering a free 2 month trial of the app, with the promo code "ABA2019".



BBC launches "Own It" app for children

The Own It app has drawn on input and support from many different child-focused charities and welfare groups including ABA, Mental Health Foundation, NSPCC, the Diana Award, and Childnet.



Facebook to hide number of likes on posts to protect user wellbeing

A trial of hiding reactions on posts to some users has been shown to be beneficial to mental health; it aims focus on the quality of their interactions and the quality of the content rather than on the number of likes of reactions.



Algorithms can be used on Twitter to detect accounts which bully

A new tool can identify Twitter accounts engaging in bullying with over 90% accuracy, according to researchers.



Instagram launches "restrict" tool to address bullying

Where many users do not want to report or block those bullying them for fear of further abuse, the tool allows users to "quietly protect" themselves from online bullying by hiding comments from view and blocking bullying accounts from seeing when a user is online.



The B Word - podcast is launched

When you hear the word 'bullying' - what immediately comes to mind? Listen to peoples experiences, reflections and advice they'd give to their younger selves.
