Assessment: Identifying the need, measuring the impact

Can your school evidence the impact of your RSHE curriculum?

Course Outline

Schools should have the same high expectations of the quality of pupils' work in RSHE as other subject areas. A strong curriculum will build on the knowledge pupils have previously acquired. Teaching should be assessed and assessments used to identify progress and interventions. RSHE formative and summative assessment requires more implicit and creative methods than other curriculum subjects.

Attendees of the course will know how to assess pupil knowledge, values and skills acquired through the RSHE curriculum.

- understand why RSHE assessment is important in maintaining a needs-led, age and stage appropriate approach to RSHE
