The new PSHE curriculum: This training will prepare you to teach about mental health, using the PSHE Association resources

Outline

Teaching about mental health and emotional well-being promotes pupils' well-being through the development of healthy coping strategies and an understanding of their own emotions as well as those of other people. It can also play a vital role in safeguarding pupils. In a small scale survey, 91% of students said that young people should learn about mental health through the PSHE teaching programme.

Description

This workshop will support you in developing the skills, knowledge and understanding needed to teach this crucial but challenging aspect of the PSHE education curriculum safely and effectively. You will also be able to access the guidance and lesson plans for the teaching programme developed by the PSHE association, with funding from the Department of Education.

It is facilitated by Dr Bianca Finger-Berry, Educational Psychology and Specialist Support

It is expected that staff will be implementing this teaching programme in their schools. A feedback tool for students, to consider the initial impact of the programme, is available.
