Nature-inspired art symbolising the community coming together and finding solace in the natural world.

Three Norfolk schools have made embroidered fabric leaves as a symbol of welcome to people and families from abroad. In return a group of students learning English with the charity English+, and refugee families, have also embroidered leaves as a symbol of making a new life, 'a new leaf' in the UK. Sanctuary During the Pandemic: Refugee and Asylum-Seeker Experiences in Times of COVID-19

Wednesday 16th June, 12-1pm

This UEA University of Sanctuary event will address the impact of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic on the lives of refugees and asylum-seekers. Drawing on observations from refugee camps in Greece and networks in Norwich, the speakers will discuss how the pandemic context has affected the provision of sanctuary support. Key themes will include the securitisation of refugee camps in Greece, obstacles in mental health care provision and challenges in applying for refugee status in the UK.
