NPQ in Leading Behaviour and Culture

Improve pupil wellbeing through consistency of approach and practice. Create a warm whole-school culture. Fully funded for all state schools.



Q: Who is it for?

A: Those who are, or are aspiring to be, responsible for leading pupil behaviour and culture and supporting others in these areas – for example Heads of Year, Heads of House, or Pastoral Managers.

Q: Do I need to hold QTS?

A: No, although the qualification contains sections on teaching and learning. Participants must have a Teacher Reference Number (TRN): the NPQ Registration Service has information on how to apply for a TRN if a participant doesn't already have one.

Q: What's involved?

A: Starting in January, a 12-month blend of flexible online learning, online discussion, virtual workshops and face to face workshops. This is followed by an 8-day assessment window where you will complete a 1500-word case study assessment to demonstrate your understanding of real leadership and change.

Q: Who are the facilitators?

A: Keith Bates, Headteacher at Eaton Hall Specialist Academy and Jenny Reeves, SEND Lead at St John the Baptist CMAT.

Q: How do I apply?

A: Make sure you have your TRN to hand, and then visit the [DfE registration page](#). When you have completed this simple form, TDT will email you a full application form, at which stage more information is required e.g. teaching and leadership experience, name of the sponsor. The final step is for the sponsor (a senior person within your organisation) to endorse the application.
