We provide plans for one-off lessons that can also be extended into a series of lessons, with more emphasis on the creative aspect of the work.

Historical Inspiration for 2022

The Kindertransport

A Day of Welcome will take its historical inspiration from the Kindertransport (Children's Transport). During 1938–1939, various rescue efforts were made to help over 10,000 children, most of whom were Jewish, escape persecution in Nazi Germany. The children arrived in Britain on trains and boats, and were placed in foster homes, hostels, schools and farms. Everyone hoped that the children's escape to Britain would be brief, but the last train left Germany just two days before the start of World War II. Most of the children never returned home.

Our resources will introduce the historical and political crises leading to the Kindertransport, along with remarkable stories of the children's arrival in the Eastern region and other parts of the UK. Building on this, our resources for 2023 will focus on stories of settlement and integration as the children made new lives in the Eastern region, and beyond.
