Early Career Framework

The first year of our Early Careers Framework (ECF) programme has really gone from strength to strength. Our guidance and support has been much appreciated as we enter a new era of induction for newcomers to the teaching profession.

As a delivery partner for the Full Induction Programme (FIP), we ensure that all the statutory requirements of the ECF are met. Together with the personalised and personable support we offer, it really takes the pressure off individual schools to have the work done for them!

Over 2021–22, we have hosted conferences and clinics which have taken place both at our Teaching School Hub in Norwich and online, ensuring flexibility and access for all. Early Career Teacher (ECT) training has covered important topics such as habits of planning, the science of learning, routines to manage behaviour and responsive teaching. Mentors are also offered training and support to effectively fulfil their roles – with instructional coaching the key.

Alongside our CPD days, ECTs also have access to Steplab, an online platform which offers an array of modules, intended on building teachers' skills in the classroom in bite-sized chunks. This approach alongside instructional coaching, which negates cognitive overload, has been warmly received by ECTs on the programme.

"Thanks to the structure of the ECT programme, I have been able to anchor my development to a specific goal each week." ECT, Hethersett Academy Above the training offer, we provide a high level of support to all our schools. We communicate important information via a monthly newsletter, Framed, which includes contributions from participants on the course.

We have run information-sharing webinars and conduct helpful school visits. Participants on our course are also entitled to access to our Trust curriculum resources, offered the opportunity to shadow leaders and can expand their network by meeting fellow ECTs and mentors alike.

If your school is considering employing an ECT for next year, it is important you know the statutory framework and understand the commitment required.

National Professional Qualifications

The NPQs are continuing apace! Since our last newsletter in January, our participants have had three clinics. These are facilitated two hour sessions which take place every half-term, and we have received great feedback from participants on their value for sharing ideas and discussing their online learning in a structured way. Several participants mentioned how worthwhile it is to get different perspectives from peers in other MATs, phases or types of school.

"It is really great to interact with other senior leaders in different contexts and the learning is practical as there are many inschool examples" NPQ Participant Congratulations to all of our participants who have started new roles in summer term or have secured new positions for September 2022. One of the advantages of the new and reformed NPQs is how much easier they are to continue when

moving to a new role or school. The learning and the examples provided are useful in any school context, and the focus of the programme is on how to apply this learning to any situation which may occur in schools. The assessment in the former NPQ programmes required the continuity of completing a project over a minimum of two terms, whereas the new and reformed NPQs are assessed on an open-book essay on the participants' response to a case study.

Frequently Asked Questions -

Can I be an ECT and do an NPQ?

We would advise you to wait until you have completed your two-years as an ECT before applying for an NPQ due to time commitments and potential scheduling clashes.

Does it matter what type of school I work at?

No! You can take part in an NPQ if you working at a primary, secondary, special school, pupil referral unit and sixth form or FE college. You can take an NPQ if you work for an independent school, however, the funding may differ.
