This course will look at what schools need to do to in order to make online safety a priority across all areas of the school.

As part the day, full CEOP Think You Know Training will be provided, including certification.

This course is designed to support high-quality leadership and management of online safety, including resources to support curriculum teaching of online safety across all key stages. This will cover the latest updates from Keeping Children Safe in Education.

Outcomes include:

- Look at young people's use of the internet and the latest online trends
- Consider how the teaching of online safety can be embedded into the curriculum
- Cover the expectations from Ofsted around online safety and how to meet these
- Consider how schools can engage with parents around online safety
- Discuss the policies and procedures relating to online safety which schools should have in place.
