 enable participants to develop their knowledge and confidence in supporting
 children and young people with speech, language and communication needs and
 provide them with the opportunity to develop a range of practical skills to fulfil a
 school- based support role
- Norfolk SENDCo Now | Norfolk Services for Schools This training is designed for SENDCos who are new to the role; new to Norfolk; teachers aspiring to be a SENDCo, assistant SENDCos and those who would like to refresh their knowledge. The training aims to provide you with the knowledge that you need to navigate SEND support and advice in Norfolk. This is a 5-day course package. Day one will be a face-to-face meeting
