School Improvement Through School Self-Evaluation

This course for headteachers will explore strategies for leading and managing a self-review process over a school year and beyond and how to involve senior managers, teachers, governors and others in rigorous and challenging self-review activities. The programme will include current issues relating to pupils' academic performance and the function of the school development and improvement plan in bringing about improvements in provision for pupils and staff. This new course builds upon other recent training in this area such as Ofsted's accredited three-day course 'Helping Schools to Carry out Self-Evaluation.'
