SEMH

This MHWB network session will provide your school with practical evidence-based resources and illustrative examples of good practice to **develop and monitor interventions**, helping you make a meaningful difference for pupils within your school

Mental health pilot

Norfolk Children's Services and Norfolk Integrated Care Board (ICB) have been selected to work with Anna Freud Centre, The Charlie Waller Foundation and the National Children's Bureau to co-produce, deliver and evaluate a **mental health training programme for the wider children's workforce**. The training will aim to help all workers who meet children receive the same basic training in emotional health, much as we skill everyone in how to safeguard children. The training package will be co-produced with young people, parents, and carers, as well as representatives from the children's workforce. - Resources and training to facilitate your own Steps for parents' workshop, securing consistent strategies between school and home for maximum impact.
- A range of high-quality resources and tools with expert guidance to contextualise and embed to meet the bespoke needs of your school/s.
- Half-termly Norfolk Steps webinars, providing access to expert speakers and Steps support across a range of Inclusion and SEND themes. This academic year includes Supporting learners with SEMH; Supporting learners with Autism; Supporting MSA's with behaviour; Supporting learners with ADHD.
