Could you help other parents or carers?

The volunteer Independent Parental Supporters trained by Parent Partnership are, as usual, working very hard to support parents/carers around the County. They have supported over 70 new families this year in a number of different ways for example, making sure parents have the information they need, attending meetings at school with parents, reading through proposed statements, helping with report and letter writing.

Volunteers come from a variety of backgrounds. Some are parents who have children with special educational needs (SEN) themselves; some have worked with children or people with special needs; some are either gaining skills for future employment or have recently retired from work. They all have in common a genuine wish to help parents and carers of children with SEN.

We are currently holding our second training course this year and a group of enthusiastic, new volunteers will have just completed the course by the time you are reading this newsletter.

Our next 5 day course runs on Wednesdays between **September 18th** and **October 16th.** It will be held at the Assembly House in Norwich from 9.30 am - 3.30 pm. The course is accredited by the **Open College Network.**
