Recent guidelines for English give immediate priority to securing the place of speaking and listening both as a key foundation for literacy and also as an essential component for all learning. Working in role and drama strategies provide an engaging way of creating vivid and meaningful contexts for modeling and developing speaking and listening in classes, pairs and groups.

- provide a model for the integration of speaking, listening, reading and writing
- consider recent research relevant to "talk" and learning.
