

STANDARDS FUND: ADDITIONAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

ADVANCED CERTIFICATE/POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE: AN INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH TO LEARNING DIFFICULTIES (SEVERE, PROFOUND AND COMPLEX)

The LEA is pleased to offer a limited number of *funded places for teachers and SENCOs* to gain a nationally recognised qualification

A one-year, distance learning course accredited by the University of Birmingham, commencing autumn 2005. Students receive study packs, regional tutorial support and attend residential weekends.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry requirements are a degree for the PG Cert, or a teaching certificate for the Ad Cert, plus two years relevant work experiences.

BACKGROUND

Most children with severe, profound and complex needs attend special schools, but some attend mainstream schools. The programme will cover issues for staff working in either setting, with a particular emphasis on learning and development.

COURSE CONTENT

Module One: Understanding Learning difficulties (Severe, Profound and Complex)

This module aims to establish the nature of severe, profound and complex learning difficulties and introduce the provision and services that are currently available for children.

Module Two: Interventions for People with Learning Difficulties (Severe, Profound and Complex) This module is based on the practicalities of designing, implementing and evaluating interventions for children with learning difficulties associated with social care, health and therapy and education.

Module Three: Learning Difficulties (Severe, Profound and Complex): Communication and Behaviour This module is designed to encourage participants to explore, in detail, two central and connected aspects of working with children with learning difficulties: communication and behaviour that challenges.

ASSIGNMENTS

All assignments (3000 words for Ad Cert, 4000 words for PGCert) are based on your own practice. There will be a free choice of topics but suggestions will be made to help you decide.

ACCREDITATION

Successful completion of the course can lead to the award of an Advanced Certificate in Education or a Post Graduate Certificate. At the discretion of the University, candidates may be able to study for Post Graduate Certificate rather than an Advanced Certificate.

COURSE FEES

Course fees will be paid by the LEA (subject to confirmation of Standards Fund for 2005/2006). The only additional expenses will be for the purchase of books and travel/supply/accommodation for the residential weekends/regional tutorials.

You will then be sent further details and a university registration form, which must be completed to ensure entry requirements are met. Places will be limited to one per school in the first instance and priority will be given to those schools not previously represented on the course.
