Forum Theatre is a method that can be used to explore any subject area, developing pupils' skills of communication and negotiation and social/emotional intelligence.

- use an inclusive, creative and affective process to engage and inspire pupils to explore issues of sustainability and citizenship;
- develop a culture of participant learner as opposed to learner consumer;
- inspire teachers and pupils towards sustainable practices.
