This course is designed to provide the school technician with the confidence to tackle simple maintenance and repair tasks.

The following will be covered:

- Dismantling the microscope.
- Cleaning the mechanical parts.
- Lubrication.
- Re-assembly and adjustment of mechanical parts.
- Cleaning the optical components.
- Testing the serviced instrument.

The delegates should bring as many as possible of the following items:

- Two microscopes needing a service (if possible 1 junior type and 1 A-Level type).
- A soft, lint-free rag.
- A set of screwdrivers from small, instrument sizes up to that needed for the largest screws on the microscopes.
- A set of Allen Keys to fit the sockets on the microscopes.
- An overall (some parts can be dirty and greasy).

NB A stereo-microscope is not appropriate for this course. The microscopes do not need to be working.
