- A relaxation on deadlines and a greater understanding from the LEA on ICT problems for heads and admin staff.
- A very good response to the snapp questionnaire (37%) which has enabled snapp to put forward a measured response to funding for the primary sector see item on school budgets
- Better communications to all members minutes and newsletters now available via ESINET plus a termly newsletter
- A reappraisal of LEA partnership working groups to slim down bureaucracy

Then arrange to meet half termly preferably away from school so that you will not be called upon to deal with aggravation. The old adage of "...a problem shared is a problem halved..." is certainly true when you find that the nagging concern which has been bothering you for days is also causing similar worries for colleagues. After talking together and looking at possible solutions it is amazing how invariably your problem is no longer insoluble.

BUDGETS – FINANCE

SNAPP has recently put together a paper to request more funding for the primary sector. However, a major obstacle to this is the large budget surpluses that have been carried over by some school. We would urge all members to make sure that such sums are clearly identified for specific needs/projects. We desperately need additional resources for all primary schools if we are going to be able to manage our workload and responsibilities effectively and provide the best opportunities for our staff and pupils. STANDARDS FUNDS – CATCH!!

Sometimes things are not all they seem. Take your budget for example – Form LMSBSF2003 – in particular. You need to beware that certain of these funds E3SIMP and E3LITS have parts of them that are earmarked for specific courses for staff. These INSET sheets often come out marked 'fully funded' which means that you have already been given funds for this via standards funds. We are asking for these areas to be clarified immediately and in future years for funding to arrive with full instructions not money.
