## Artsmark

Norfolk Local Authority has been actively promoting and supporting schools applying for Artsmark. An impressive and increasing number of Norfolk schools have carried out the full self review audit of arts provision that the application requires.

We provide:

- An INSET course in the Autumn Term each year to support the application process led by a national assessor
- LEA verbal and written references for Arts Council England as required

## Spaces for Sport and the Arts

Several Norfolk schools have received funding from Arts Council England and Sport England jointly, to develop spaces for arts and sports. These spaces are intended for use both in and beyond the school day, and for community use. All schools should consider existing school spaces as potential arts hubs within their communities.

# Arts in Education

- All pupils should have access to high quality experiences of learning in and through the arts and of a range of cultural and creative activities and arts experiences both in school and beyond the classroom.
- All pupils should be supported to recognise, develop and celebrate their own creativity as artists and to appreciate and respond to the creative and artistic endeavours and products of others.

## Aims for Arts in Education

1. To identify, support, develop and promote excellent and enjoyable learning and achievement in and through the arts for every child.
2. To support and develop teaching with and for creativity in all subjects and across the curriculum, including across the arts.
3. To support school improvement and development in and through the medium of arts education.
4. To promote the arts as a means of actively motivating, engaging and challenging all children in their learning.
5. To improve children's health and well-being, self esteem and confidence.
6. To support teachers to develop children's spirituality and self awareness, and appreciation of the arts as a medium for understanding, representing and challenging attitudes, values and feelings.
7. To promote the development of high quality, sustainable arts partnerships with artists in schools, and creative and cultural organisations.

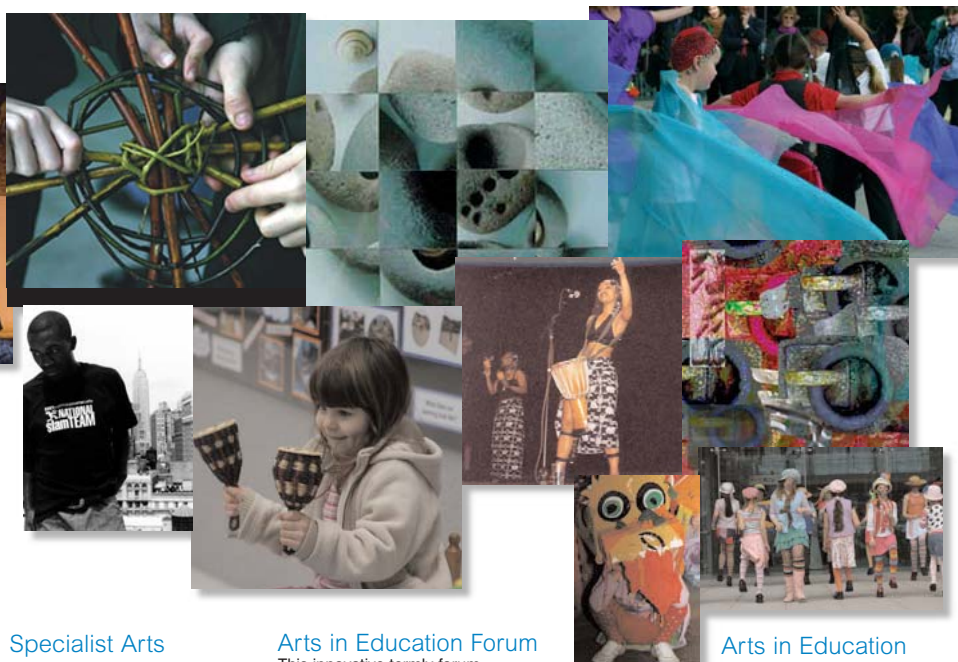
