Activity and Event Ideas

Here are just some of the ideas for activities and events that your school could undertake as part of Bike to School Week. We understand that, due to local circumstances, not all the ideas will be relevant for your school.

Playground / Classroom Activities

Ask your local cycle shop or cycling organisation to provide a "Doctor Bike" to carry out bicycle safety checks

Hold challenges events such as a bike-handling course, off road tracks or slalom courses, slow bike races etc.

Norfolk County Council Road Safety Unit has designed a Y4 'playground' based young cyclist course. The course is based upon the National standard for child cyclist training. For further details please contact your Area Road Safety Officer 01603 223348.

One school is planning to start its "Year of the Cycle" during Bike to School Week. This will include new cycle storage, training, promotional activities and competitions.

Mad Hatters Day – a competition to dress up cycle helmets. *NB please make sure that no solvent glues or pens come into contact with the cycle helmets.*

Mapping exercises showing the best routes into school for cyclists or local networks for circular cycle ways

Other Activities

Family Cycle Ride – invite parents to cycle with their children

Sponsored Bike Ride

Big Bike Bash – use good cycle-ways or off road cycle tracks to have a trip out from school instead of taking the bus

Writing a successful Travel Plan will allow your school to receive extra Devolved Formula Capital funding. Primary schools will receive £3750 + £5 per pupil and Secondary schools will receive £5000 + £5 per pupil. This can be spent on new cycle storage and lockers.
