

# Understanding Children's Mental Health & Emotional Well-being

# About this programme

This is the introductory training for new Primary Mental Health Workers (Children, Young People and their families) from the Family Support Team. There are also a limited number of places available for other colleagues in Health, Education, and Social Services.

# **Programme Aims**

The course will provide an intensive introduction to child mental health and is based on teaching from Child and Adolescent Mental Health Professionals. The focus will be on understanding and knowledge rather than skills and methods; although there will be an opportunity to hear about interventions currently being used.

There will be an expectation that participants reflect on their learning and they will be encouraged to keep a log of this, with discussion sessions as part of the course

The contents of this Programme will incorporate issues of equal opportunities and antioppressive practice to assist participants to understand and challenge all forms of discrimination.

#### **Learning Objectives**

By the end of the programme participants will:

1.	have gained an understanding of the tiered approach to Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services and understand how their own agency fits into the multitiered, multi-agency approach.
2.	have an understanding of common mild and emerging mental health disorders in children and young people and to be able to contribute this understanding to assessment and analysis of children and families needs.
3.	have knowledge of varied approaches and intervention options at tier 2 (early intervention).
4.	understand the presenting features of common conditions requiring specialist intervention.
5.	recognise when children should be referred on to a more specialised service.

# Methodology

Content will include:

- Presentations by experienced CAMHS professionals using a variety of methods Including some participation
- Daily recap and reflection sessions, participants will be encouraged to keep their own log of learning.
