Events at The Forum in Norwich

Clearly, there are many areas of overlap between the themes but the following points might help you to think of the areas where your school could make a contribution. You will be able to think of many others!

Investigative learning/thinking skills

- Brain gym
- Enquiry drama
- · Philosophy with children
- Learning styles
- Using music to stimulate thinking
- Children understanding how their brain works

And...

PSHE/citizenship

- Playgrounds projects, playground buddies, peer mediation
- School council, circle time
- Parachute games, work with puppets
- · Global citizenship links with schools abroad
- · Parental involvement, links with the community
- Activities related to Healthy Schools involvement
- Enrichment activities e.g. school visits, visitors to school etc.

And...

Bio-diversity/the environment

- Energy investigations with ICT mini turbines and renewables
- Debate through drama and role play forum theatre as a tool for development with sustainability issues
- Links with other countries in connection with Education for Sustainable Development And...

Communication

- Through the spoken and written word
- Through mathematics
- Through ICT
- Through modern foreign languages
- Through movement/mime/body language
- Through the use of Braille/British Sign Language

And...

Creativity

- Through the arts
- Through experimental work across the curriculum
- Through work with artists, writers, architects, scientists, other visitors to the school
- Through children's involvement in 'real life' problem solving in the life of the school
- Through links with community projects

And...

Ideas for early years contributions

Performance

- Street/ playground games and action rhymes
- Dance related to cultural festivals e.g. Chinese dragon dance



How can schools contribute to events at The Forum?

On each day there will be opportunities for schools to stage an example of their work at The Forum, such as a **performance** or **demonstration**.

There will be four such activities each day – at 11.00, 12.00, 1.00 and 2.00 – with schools from all areas of the county taking part.

Each activity will:

- relate directly to one of the themes for each day;
- · demonstrate children learning in active ways;
- be about 15 to 20 minutes long;
- be able to be staged in an open space at The Forum.

Funding will be available for transport and other costs, including supply cover.

Ideas for contributions

Some ideas of ways in which schools might contribute displays, demonstrations and performances for each theme include:

• Dance, drama, music or PE presentations
• Playground or parachute games
• Investigative activities in action

• Written work – collections of creative writing or accounts of activities/projects

• Visual images in a range of media
• 2 and 3 dimensional models – made or in production
• Digital photographs or video

Activity

- Role play area this would have to be a feature of the permanent display as it would take time to set up
- Story sacks story boxes in use
- Interactive maths games

Display

- Digital photos which sequence work (e.g. large construction work with big bricks) with captions which capture what children said
- Representational work which links, for example, to creativity or to biodiversity
