

Childcare in extended schools







What is an Extended School?

An Extended School is one that provides a range of services and activities often beyond the school day to help meet the needs of its pupils, their families and the wider community. This includes out of school care for children and young people up to the age of 14 (and 16 with special needs). This could be before/after school, holiday care or service for the under 5's.

Why would schools want to provide childcare services?

The advantages of providing childcare on school premises are vast and can have a positive impact not only for the school but also children, families and the wider community. These have been outlined below.

Advantages for the school:

- Improved relationships with parents and greater parental involvement
- Stronger links with local community, with the school as the focal point
- Recruitment and retention of school staff
- Reduced late arrivals, poor attendance and underperformance of pupils at schools
- Improvements in motivation and behaviour
- Increased pupil numbers as a result of attracting parents to the school
- An easier transition throughout school life
- Ability to offer extra support to identified vulnerable children and families
- Ensuring children have a healthy and nutritious meal/snack at the start or end of the day
- Supporting social activities for children who may otherwise have difficulties
- Explore the possibility of partnership arrangements with local providers

For children and young people:

- Access to activities which widen and enrich their experiences
- Higher achievement, confidence and self esteem
- Improved interpersonal and social skills
- Developing responsibility for themselves and others
- Safe caring environment
- Increase skills and fitness through sports activities contributing to the reduction of childhood obesity

For parents:

- Single point of access for an integrated range of family services
- Peace of mind and reduced disruption to family life
- The opportunity for parents to start or return to work or to extend their working hours with their children fully cared for
- Access to training or further education based at the school with on-site childcare

For the community:

- A major contribution to social inclusion
- More people in work, education or training, reducing child poverty
- Reduced traffic levels at peak times
- Fewer unsupervised children on the streets

Schools wishing to introduce childcare services have the following options:

- Offer and manage childcare services directly
- Work in partnership with existing or new voluntary or private providers
- Delegate the delivery of childcare services to an outside organisation
