

Welcome to Out There 2008 – a brand new International Festival of Arts and Culture which is taking place in Great Yarmouth from Wednesday 29 October to Sunday 2 November 2008. Out There is produced by SeaChange Arts in association with Zap Art, and supported by Great Yarmouth Borough Council, the European Union Culture Programme, and enterpriseGY.

2008 celebrates the 800th anniversary of Great Yarmouth, granted its freedom by King John in 1208, and SeaChange Arts is delighted to launch Out There in this centenary year with a programme of events and creations as exciting, colourful and international as 800 years of Yarmouth's history.

We have an inspirational programme of entertainment featuring local, national and international acts and artists from across the world including the UK, France, Portugal, Finland, Cuba, Zimbabwe, Iceland, Spain and Brazil. Out There is making good use of Great Yarmouth's extraordinary array of indoor venues and outdoor spaces to bring the town alive through a unique mix of street arts, music, tightrope, fireworks, dance, theatre, cabaret, visual arts, digital projection, horses, participatory workshops, food, drink, and even Finnish sauna!

With over 100 artists involved and the majority of entertainment being outside and free, Out There 2008 promises to be a fantastic, fun, family-friendly festival with something for everyone.

How can Great Yarmouth schools get involved?

There's lots of opportunities for community involvement in Out There from volunteering to learning to performing. You can find more details of creative activities, learning & skills opportunities and performance programmes below.

Volunteering

You could get experience in areas such as events management, marketing, technical support, stewarding and front of house.

Have-a-go workshops

You can try lots of activities including:

- Mask making workshops with Limbik theatre company at 11am on Wednesday 29 and Thursday 30 October at the Time & Tide Museum
- Samba music and drumming with Brazilian band Moleque De Rua, at 3.30pm on Thursday 30 October at St Nicholas Church
- Lantern making with Jankie D, at 1pm on Saturday 1 November at Christchurch, King Street
- Tightrope walking with Dr Ken, at 5pm on Saturday 1 November in the Market Place (suitable even for those who don't like heights!)

Lantern parade

All lanterns made in workshops will be part of a choreographed Lantern Parade on Saturday 1 November. The parade will involve local school children, families and professional performers who will lead residents and visitors starting off at 5.45pm from King Street and along to the Market Place. Some of these Lanterns will have been made by school children in workshops leading up to the festival and others will be made on Saturday afternoon.

Youth and Community Festival

On Friday 31 October from 1pm – 6pm in the Festival Village and Market Place, there is a programme of free taster workshops and performances by young people, emerging artists and community groups where you can just turn up and get involved.

Workshops include:

- Japanese Taiko drumming at 1pm on the Out There bus in the Market Place
- Manga art at 1pm in the Festival Village in the Market Place
- From 1pm, drop-in sessions: Electronic music-making and programming with Access to Music, henna art with Sheila Kaur, mural workshops with Hub 4 all taking place around the Market Place.
- From 3pm, drop-in visual arts workshops with artists from UK, Portugal and Finland on the Out There
 bus in the Market Place

Learning and Skills

C-Attack!



Dende Collective theatre company are looking for actors and people interested in creating and making set, props and costumes. This project is supported by the National Lottery through Arts Council England.

C-Attack! is a specially commissioned street theatre show that will be part of the Out There Festival and will take place in the Market Place on Friday 31 October at 6.00pm. The show will be performed by a group of professional actors and volunteers (that's you!) who will take

over the Market Place to tell the story of when Great Yarmouth was invaded by bizarre sea creatures.

By taking part in C-Attack you will:

- Work with a professional artistic team (directors, actors, set and costume designers, etc...)
- Gain important work experience for your CV
- Work with people from various nationalities
- Improve your English (bilingual rehearsals)
- Learn theatre techniques
- Have fun after work or school
- Take part in a unique experience
