ICT for the Gifted Pupil in a Secondary school St Nicholas Primary School, Stevenage will be presenting their work on an ICT/ Geography project for able Year 5 students which used digital video technology and involved a collaboration between local primary schools, studying their locality and a secondary school. Enrichment in Humanities at KS3 A middle school approach to providing opportunities for special extension work for gifted students: the school has created a programme of activities which invites a small group of pupils to work with an adult in an aspect of the curriculum to offer extended opportunities for learning. 4.	Mantle of the Expert Mantle of the Expert is an innovative enquiry based approach to learning where children learn by solving problems and completing tasks set in a fictional world. This approach to learning is not intended to replace current teaching methods rather to enrich existing practice.	Pri Essex AM

Tracking Gifted and Talented provision through lesson observation and pupil questionnaire - As a result of research carried out in both primary and secondary schools we have drawn some conclusions about what makes for effective identification of and provision for gifted and talented pupils.
