The weekend is part of the BTCV Institute for Environmental Conservation's (BIEC) programme of courses in natural history and practical conservation skills for adults in Norfolk. All successful participants will receive a certificate from BIEC in the subjects covered by the weekend.



The weekend

If you have an interest in woodland management, help manage one, want to acquire woodland craft skills or are interested in the countryside then this 2-part weekend course is for you.

Based in the woodlands of Holt Hall Field Study, this is a practical based 2part course in how to manage small woodlands for wildlife and utilise the byproducts of this sustainable management with woodland crafts.

On the first part of the weekend, Saturday 18th, learn about the reasons for and the history behind woodland management. Learn about woodland management techniques and how to recognise them in woodland and how to plan future management.

After a guided walk with Holt Hall staff through the ancient woodland that is part of the field study centre estate practice traditional woodland skills. These will include learning how to coppice trees to encourage new growth, layer poles (branches) from coppice stools to propagate more trees and build log piles that are useful to wildlife.

The second day of the weekend, Sunday 19th, is an introduction to Green Woodworking skills that best utilise the wood produced when woodlands are managed for wildlife.

Learn about the history of Green Woodworking and the different properties and uses of different woods, and how to make craft and utility items that can be easily made from greenwood today.

Everyone taking part in the weekend should be able to make a Greenwood craft item. These could include wooden spoons, ladles and bird feeders.

Gloves, tools and materials will be provided but please wear sound footwear and working clothes.

The Tutor

Toby Cheadle is passionate about working woodlands and is a spoon maker, charcoal burner and willow weaver. These skills Toby has developed working for the Scottish Wildlife Trust, Borders Forest Trust and BTCV over the last 10 years.

The inclusive course fee is just £120

Which includes, v.a.t., all meals, tea/coffee, accommodation and tuition.

Holt Hall is situated one mile north of Holt in North Norfolk . Access is via either the Kelling Road (main entrance) or Cley Road. Holt itself can be reached along the B1149 from Norwich or the A148 from King's Lynn.
