Healthy Schools Instructions for downloading logo

Once you have joined the programme or have achieved National Healthy School Status you are entitled to use the relevant Healthy School logo on your school publications.

You can do this by going to www.healthyschools. gov.uk/brandguide/. Once you have logged on, you then need to select 'The Logo' which can be found at the top of the page. You will then be presented with three different types of logo. If you are a committed Healthy School but have not yet achieved full status you can download the National or Local logos only. If you are a school, which has been awarded Healthy School status, you are entitled to download the award logo.

More Norfolk schools gain national award!

139 schools across Norfolk have now met the standard to achieve National Healthy School Status and dozens more are nearly there. Schools that have achieved status should already have received their handsome plaque - and others will be in the school post in the next couple of weeks.

If your school is nearly there or you just feel that you need a little help to complete the process - contact one of the team soon. The next batch of schools is currently going through the validation process and due to achieve National Healthy School Status early in the summer term. The process for applying is simple and records the work already underway in school - it does not rely on boxes full of evidence or hefty portfolios.

In the Autumn term, Norfolk County Council, The Active Citizenship Unit, Healthy Norfolk Schools and Thorpe St Andrew Senate hosted a day inviting all the school

councils in Norfolk to share what they do in their schools and find out what they would want from a network that connected all of them.



We had a good response with twelve high schools and six primary schools attending from across the county. Students took part in workshops and activities to help them think about how the ideal school council should be run and how this is reflected in their own school council, how to conduct effective discussions and next steps towards networking.

In the staff workshop we shared lots of ideas and opinions which everyone agreed was very beneficial and everyone realised that there are lots of very effective ways that a school council could be run.

Every school that attended exchanged contact details so everyone can keep in touch. When and if we get a countywide network we will already be a "step in front".

Personally, I had a brilliant time meeting with people that are in the same position as me and I really valued hearing their ideas.

Free loan of equipment to promote effective hand washing

The Food Safety Team at Norwich City Council are able to loan materials to primary schools to promote effective hand washing.

Equipment includes:

- Effective
 Hand
 Washing
 posters and
 educational
 literature
- Glowing HandsMachine - UV hand inspection cabinet
- Glitter Bug Potion glows when exposed to UV light
- 'THINK STOP WASH' (or similar) stickers

Access to a wash hand basin with hot and cold water is required. You will also need soap and towels plus a mains socket to connect the UV inspection cabinet.

Law change on tobacco sales



The law for selling tobacco changed on October 1st in a move to prevent young people from taking up smoking. It is now illegal to sell tobacco products to anyone under the age of 18 in England and Wales. Shops selling to under 18s now risk prosecution and a fine of up to £2,500.
