## Art Workshops for all Key Stages

#### **Careful Carvers**

Explore ideas about sculpture in the gallery; focus on surface feel and texture. Create a simple and natural 3D form using a bar of soap. This is a practical workshop led by a museum educator.

#### **Sculpture Culture**

Collect ideas and inspiration from the works in the exhibition. Work with an artist to create a sculptural piece.
