Art Workshops for all Key Stages

Our art workshops can help pupils to :

- Look at sculptures made of different materials
- Develop a vocabulary to describe their qualities

Rocks and Pebbles

£2.50 per pupil **KS 1** 1½ hours

Look closely at the sculptures in the exhibition. Investigate holes and textures in rocks and pebbles and create a clay sculpture based on these natural forms. This is a practical workshop led by a museum educator.

Careful Carvers

£2.50 per pupil **KS 2** 1½ hours

Explore ideas about sculpture in the gallery; focus on surface feel and texture. Create a simple and natural 3D form using a bar of soap. This is a practical workshop led by a museum educator.

Sculpture Culture

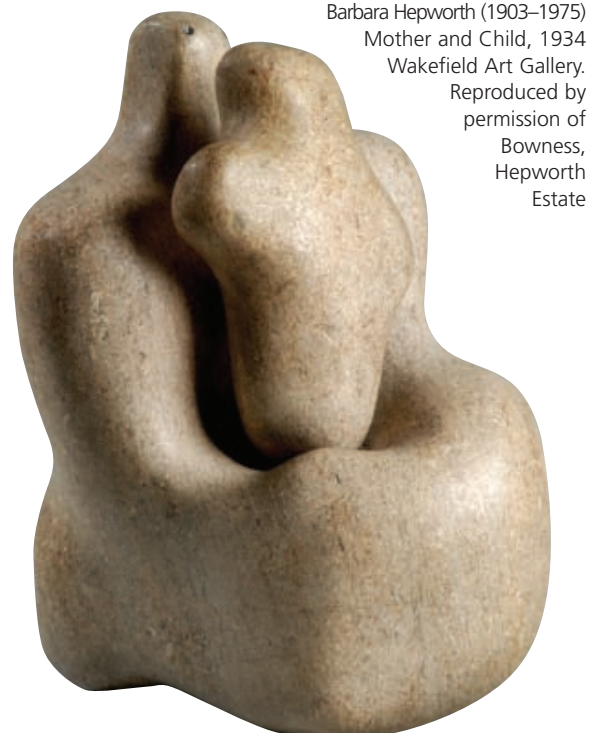
£3.00 per pupil **KS 3** **KS 4** 2 hours
