HLTA SPECIALISMS SECONDARY SCHOOLS ONLY MATHS AND SCIENCE – SUPPORT PROGRAMME FOR 2009/10

Additional training is available for candidates working towards achieving HLTA status in these subject areas. The mathematics and science specialisms are aligned with the existing HLTA programme. Candidates complete a subject knowledge and skills review with their line manager to determine their existing subject knowledge. Any gaps in knowledge will need to be addressed before the candidate goes forward for assessment. The breadth of subject knowledge will depend on the context within which the candidate is working, and the candidate's line manager/headteacher will make a judgement about this. Training forms part of the HLTA programme and is fully funded by the TDA, places can be offered to all staff working in these curriculum areas however priority places will be given to HLTA candidates.

HLTA MATH

The model for delivering specialist maths support is very different with candidates being invited to join termly network meetings. Membership of these networks is continuous and candidates have the option to dip in and out depending on need. The networks are designed to offer a continuous programme of professional development. Content delivery will vary each term and is very flexible.

Participants have the opportunity to;

- Share good practice / resources
- Look at effective planning of lessons
- Cover curriculum changes
- Develop practices to support learners
- Share plans and resources
- Look at roles and responsibilities and effective working practices.

HLTA SCIENCE

Attendance at this training will enable candidates to provide evidence of the acquisition and application of subject knowledge for HLTA status. This training is suitable to all staff working in this curriculum area who want to update their subject knowledge in KS3 and 4.
