Re: Transfer of ICT information to assist continuity and progression between primary/junior schools and high school

I am writing to ask if you will contribute to an online database which will assist Norfolk high schools in planning an appropriate curriculum for new pupils, 2004 – 2005.

In our discussions with high school ICT co-ordinators, one of the key pieces of information which they would particularly value is the nature of the ICT experience of pupils in Years 5 and 6. The majority of high schools are using the National Strategy materials and it will help them to know precisely which areas have been covered prior to year 7. Done manually, this is quite a logistical exercise; some high schools, for example, receive their intake from over twenty primary phase schools.

We have constructed what we believe to be a very simple way to gather and share this information electronically. An additional service has been added to the NGfL Tracker information on the [ICT Solutions web site](#). It is called *KS3 ICT Monitoring Tool*.

Primary and Junior school ICT subject leaders are invited to complete a very simple online data collection form (no more than ten entries), which will take less than a minute to complete by clicking on a series of electronic buttons. The form asks the subject leader to indicate where pupils' ICT experience has based on the QCA scheme of work. The responses should relate to the experience of the Year 6 cohort, academic year 2003 – 2004.

All headteachers and subject leaders have been allocated user IDs and passwords for the system. However, should there be any difficulty in accessing the database, enquiries should be addressed to Amanda Carr, at ICT Solutions, telephone 0845 303 3003.

I do hope that you will be able to help us with this project. Clearly, a prompt response would be helpful. Many thanks in anticipation of your support.
