Keynote talk with Dr Anna Craft

Creativity and Learning Futures

How do we foster creativity for learners? Why is it important? What role can partners beyond our schools play? How can creativity and partnership connect with learning futures at system level? Anna will explore ways of understanding and teaching for creativity. She will argue that everyday, or 'little c' creativity, is something of which we are all capable and which lies at the heart of creativity. It is vital in a rapidly changing and globalizing world and involves, at its simplest, the nurturing of 'possibility thinking' - the shift from what is to what might be. Anna will name opportunities and challenges facing us in transforming curriculum, pedagogy and learning at classroom, school and system levels.

Dr Anna Craft is Professor of Education at Exeter University and the Open University, and is a government advisor on creative and cultural education. Once an early years and primary teacher, and with a background in national curriculum development, she now works internationally to develop life-long creativity and to link creativity with learning futures.

Workshops

Creativity and Literacy - Workshop 1 with Baden Prince

A creative approach for enhancing literacy across the curriculum using creative writing, performance poetry and storytelling. How to get children excited about using words, how to spark their imagination and encourage their use of language to express ideas. Simple, practical suggestions for group (including performance) work.

Baden is a published poet and established artist on the 'live literature' scene.

Creativity and Maths - Workshop 2 with Nicola Burrell

Nicola's work with schools focuses on looking at topics or subjects through the transformation of 2D materials into 3D objects. She will make direct links between the nature of construction and maths offering a fun and 'real' way to apply maths to many aspects of the curriculum.


Nicola is a painter/sculptor working with both the manmade and natural environment.

Creativity and Diversity - Workshop 3 with Louise Katerega

Louise will share her creative ideas for addressing diverse social and educational needs in schools through dance. This lively and inclusive session will include a variety of dance forms including English Morris, Polish, South African Gumboot and Aboriginal.

Louise is a dancer/choreographer, and works with TOPS Dance, a training programme designed to improve confidence in cross-curricular dance teaching in schools.
