


Victorian Voices

This year, the national Archive Awareness Campaign team have joined forces with Usborne Publishers to launch a short story competition for schools. The competition, aimed at Key stage 2 children, will be based on the topic, Victorian Childhood Experiences. During the autumn term, each school will be receiving a resource pack containing images from archives across the country. In addition, the pack will include literacy lesson plans, details of archives and ideas for using the resources in other lessons, such as art, history and ICT. Each school can submit a set number of entries into the competition. Regional and national winners will be chosen by a celebrity/ expert panel. Each child chosen by this panel will receive a prize, with prizes also available for schools themselves. A pack should be finding its way to you soon....

Evacuees Booklet

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The booklet contains images of documents held by the Norfolk Record Office, giving a local perspective on a national event. Documents include official and personal letters, photographs, memoirs and newspaper cuttings. The booklet is split into smaller sections, including *Why send children away from their homes?* in which pupils learn about the causes of evacuation, and *Where did evacuees stay?* in which pupils learn about the Billeting Officer and Host Family. The booklet will include questions on the documents to develop investigative and enquiry skills, and activities which will provide cross-curricular work. 
