NICARAGUAN SCHOLARSHIP APPEAL

The town of El Viejo in Nicaragua has been twinned with the City of Norwich since 1986.

During 2002, the education department was approached by the link, which is now called the Norfolk and Norwich Friendship Link, for its support in raising money to fund scholarships. The project has been endorsed, by the leaders of both the County Council and Norwich City Council.

Education in Nicaragua is technically free. However, 27% of children in El Viejo are deprived of their chance of this education because their parents cannot afford to provide uniform, exercise books, pens and pencils, and other basic education materials. A £60 scholarship will cover these costs and make it possible for a child to attend school for at least a year.

During December, members of Norfolk County Council staff, mostly from within the Education Department, donated money instead of sending internal Christmas cards. They raised enough to finance 11 scholarships.

I would now like to invite schools to participate in this scheme, encouraging all to raise the £60 it takes to fund a scholarship. I enclose a poster which can be used to publicise the scheme.
