A BOX OF REEDS (Music/Science)

A number of different types and size of accordion will be used to show the varying sounds of each instrument and how they work. One instrument will be



taken apart to show how the instrument is made up. The music selected will demonstrate the different music styles that the accordion can play and the audience will have opportunities to join in. A free illustrated Teachers' Guide to the accordion comes with this workshop. It gives the history of the instrument and explains how the instrument works.

This workshop is given by Peter Ayers and lasts for 45 minutes. It is intended for Key Stages 1 & 2 pupils. Cost: £35 a class session, £60 for two consecutive class sessions and £50 for a session of up to 100 pupils.

FOUR WINDS (Music/Science)

This workshop introduces the family of woodwind instruments and explains how they work. There will be demonstrations on all the instruments and science links relation of sound. There is a range of

made with the creation of sound. There is a range of music offered including familiar and popular tunes and there will be plenty of opportunities for pupils to interact and ask questions. This workshop is aimed at pupils at Key Stage 1 & 2.

It is led by John Burdett, and lasts for 45 minutes. Cost: £35 a class session, £60 for two consecutive class sessions and £50 for a session of up to 150 pupils.

PATRICK (Music/Literacy)

This is a unique presentation of Quentin Blake's well known children's story about Patrick who buys a violin with his

only silver coin. Blowing the dust off that violin, he begins to play a tune and remarkable events result. In this active storytelling session the story is read aloud, and illustrated by playing the violin. Children can join in by clapping and if space permits, dancing. This Key Stage 1 activity links speaking, listening, story and music in an engaging way. Rosalind Wills, a specialist violin teacher, leads this session. Duration 30 minutes. Maximum 60 pupils. Cost: £35 a session or two consecutive sessions for £60.

VOCAL GYMNASTICS (Multicultural Music)

A lively introduction to group singing through a diverse range of multicultural repertoire. Technical aspects are taught through warm-up games and physical activities. A 2 hour session is recommended, allowing around 50 minutes per group with a short break. Sessions are tailored to cater for reception up to Key Stage 3/4. Jon Payne, a specialist vocal teacher, will lead these

sessions for a maximum number of 50 participants and hopefully the school staff will join in too.

Duration 2 hours (with a 15 minute break). Cost: £70.



TUBES AND BUZZES (Music/Science) This workshop introduces the family of brass

instruments and explains how they work. There will be demonstrations on all the instruments and science links made with the

creation of the sounds. There is a range of music offered including familiar and popular tunes and there will be plenty of opportunities for pupils to interact and ask questions. This workshop is intended for pupils at Key Stage 1 & 2.

The workshop leader is Kevin Hegarty, a specialist brass teacher and lasts for 45 minutes.

Recommended maximum number of pupils 150. Cost: £35 a class session, £60 for two consecutive class sessions and £50 for a session of up to 150 pupils.

SAMBA SCHOOL (Multicultural/Music)



Samba, the vigorous essential dance rhythm of South America. This workshop introduces and explores the instruments and the rhythms used in the Samba. It aims to create one large samba group, in which all students

participate, culminating in an end of the session performance. Students will make music together, learn about Latin rhythms and the rhythmic pulse and memorise short rhythmic phrases. This workshop encourages working as a team and pupils will gain ensemble experience.

A set of Samba Drums will be provided. Pupils should be years 4-9 at Key Stage 2 & 3. Maximum 15 pupils. Ian Chopping, a specialist percussion teacher, leads this practical workshop. Duration 1 hour. Cost: £35 for one session or two consecutive sessions for £60.

SHAKE RATTLE AND ROLL



This workshop demonstration of the drum kit is for years 4-7

at Key Stage 2/3 and introduces a wide range of things percussive. It covers some of the basic techniques of percussion playing using contemporary rhythms and techniques, whilst demonstrating a range of skills to be developed in percussion lessons. This participatory workshop is led by Ian Chopping. A Drum Kit and range of small percussion instruments will be provided. The school will need to provide additional small percussion instruments for groups of above 30.

This 45 minute performance based workshop can be for individual classes or the whole school.

Cost: £35 a class session, £60 for two consecutive class sessions and £50 for a session of up to 150 pupils.
