Early Years Music Skills has been designed to meet the needs of children in

Reception	programme 1 - 3
Year 1	programme 4 - 6
Year 2	programme 7 - 9
Year 3	programme 10 - 12

Specifically trained members of the Music Education Service deliver a weekly 30 minute programme of 10 or 12 sessions as required.

Music in the Early Years aims to

- enable all children the opportunity to acquire the knowledge, skills and understanding needed to make music
- support music education in schools and the implementation of the National Curriculum for music
- develop skills attitudes and attributes that can support learning and personal development e.g. listening, using the imagination, creativity, intuition, aesthetic sensitivity, perseverance, self-confidence, ownership, sharing, literacy and numeracy

Each programme offers children enjoyment and the opportunity to learn and develop their musical skills, knowledge and understanding through

- action songs
- movement
- musical games
- musical activities
- reading appropriate musical symbols and notation

In line with the National Curriculum requirements the activities ensure that performing, composing and appraising skills are integrated and children are given opportunities to extend these skills through focussed listening to music and learning about music from different times and cultures.
